WE'RE OFF!

Preceded by frantic tree and soil clearance, work has at last begun to restore the outside of the Old Magnesia Well Pump Room (OMWPR). Drainage will be constructed, and a stonemason, a joiner, a roofer and a decorator will be working hard behind the safety barriers. In five or six weeks we expect to see the first part of FOVG's major project completed.

Harrogate Borough Council (HBC) is acting as Clerk of Works for the project and at a site meeting on 11 September Head of Parks and Open Spaces Patrick Kilburn gave the "thumbs up" for work to begin. Pictured below is the "cutting of the first sod" by HBC Parks Supervisor Chris towards the creation of a three metre wide path round the building. The soil removed has been piled near the reservoir in readiness for the restoration of its surrounding rockery.



Robert Grange is re-designing the path configuration. A decision on the types of surface for this and other paths to be planned has yet to be made. In the lead up there has been much activity behind the scenes. Planning permission had to be applied for and when that had been achieved an application had to be made to the Secretary of State as the OMWPR is a Grade II Listed building. FOVG heard of the success of the application at the beginning of September.

1940's DAY

On 10 June FOVG hosted a second 40s Day. It was a great success.12,000 people visited the park and £3,200 was raised. Much fun was had by all and the increase in people wearing 40's clothing was most encouraging. Thanks to Simon Roberts for organising a fantastically impressive display of military vehicles and equipment and to Amanda Wilkinson (Hales Bar) for running a vibrant and successful bar. The food stall, cake stall, stand hire and tombola were lucrative and the bandstand echoed with music throughout the day. The OMWPR had numerous visitors who gave generously.
