## Wartime spirit revived as 20,000 people flock to Valley Gardens

The third annual 1940s Open Day, staged by the Friends of Valley Gardens in Harrogate, attracted more than 20,000 visitors on Sunday and raised a healthy sum for the Old Magnesia Well Pump Room.

Fancy dress, Dad's Army lookalikes, war-time jeeps and the spirit of The Blitz were the order of the day last Sunday.

According to official Harrogate Borough Council figures 20,844 people entered Valley Gardens, most of whom attended the event.

They came in all costumes and all parts of the region to enjoy the full programme of live music performances from the bandstand, the various attractions round the gardens and more than two dozen stalls situated in the Sun Pavilion and down the

Colonnade.

The sunny day event also raised more than £5,000 towards the next phase of the restoration of the Old Magnesia Well Pump Room.

Hot food and drinks were available from a NAAFI style tent and Daleside ale from the Hales Bar under canvas.

Among the music acts were Cadenza, the Royal British Legion Corps of Drums, Skipton Branch, Echo 42 Big Band, Maria Manchester and Major Swing and Kitty.

There were also performances by the Molly Dancers in front of the Magnesia Cafe.

Among the sponsors were Farrah's Harrogate Toffee, Water Brands (Harrogate Spring Water) and Newnham Street Garage.
